## Nebraska Main Street Network Designated Main Street Community Application Process

## Step 1 Community start-up

All communities interested in becoming a designated Main Street community must be a Network or Rural Network Member for a minimum of 1-year before being allowed to submit an application for designation. To become a Network or Rural Network Member, download the form and submit payment. The membership form can be found on the Nebraska Main Street Network website at <u>www.nebraskamainstreet.org</u>

- Submit a letter of application to the Nebraska Main Street Network Board of Directors that includes the following:
  - Community name and population
  - Group or organization seeking Main Street designation
  - Name of contact person and title
  - Mailing address
  - Daytime phone number and email address
- □ Include a map of the proposed Main Street district
- Provide a preliminary budget showing how you will fund your Main Street organization
- □ In concise narrative form, answer the following questions—
  - 1. Why does your community want to establish a Main Street program?
  - Describe the current level of support for the Main Street program from government (city, county, state, Federal), downtown businesses, Chamber and economic development organizations, the greater business community, and citizens.
  - 3. In what ways do you feel that your community is able to make a long-term commitment, willingness and desire to become a designated Main Street community? Do you have an organization already in place and functional?
  - 4. Describe your downtown's assets (businesses, buildings, social fabric, organizations) and the historical or cultural significance of your Main Street district.
  - 5. List partnering organizations/agencies that will be working directly with your local Main Street organization.
  - 6. What are your community's major economic, physical, promotional, and organizational challenges? Why did they occur and how do they affect your Main Street district?
  - 7. Describe the level of community leadership and volunteerism in the community. Are there enough volunteers and leaders willing, interested and able to lead and participate in your Main Street program?
  - 8. What does your community expect to achieve by participating in the Main Street program?

## Step 3 On-going participation requirements

- Have broad based community support for the program including
  partnership and collaboration with other local organizations including
  municipal government
- Willingness and desire to maintain Main Street designation and continue with the program for the long-term.
- Participation in ongoing visioning and strategic work plan development.
- Historic preservation ethic.
- Active board of directors and working committees.
- Operating budget and paid professional director.
- Active participation in Nebraska Main Street Network programming (requests for technical assistance and local training, attending webinars, Meeting on Main, networking activities and events, director and board retreats, etc).
- Monthly and annual reporting requirements.
- Participation in year-end program evaluation.
- Attendance at the National Main Street Center's Main Street NOW Conference
