The existing condition of the east facade of the three-story Geneva State Bank (left) and the adjoining one-story red brick Ashby Building to the north (right) is shown in this photograph. The first floor of the 1906 bank building was extensively remodeled on the interior and exterior in 1961 (compare with Images 1 and 2). The intricate detailing of the fanlights in the Ashby Building has been obliterated by white paint which covers the glass and muntins.
